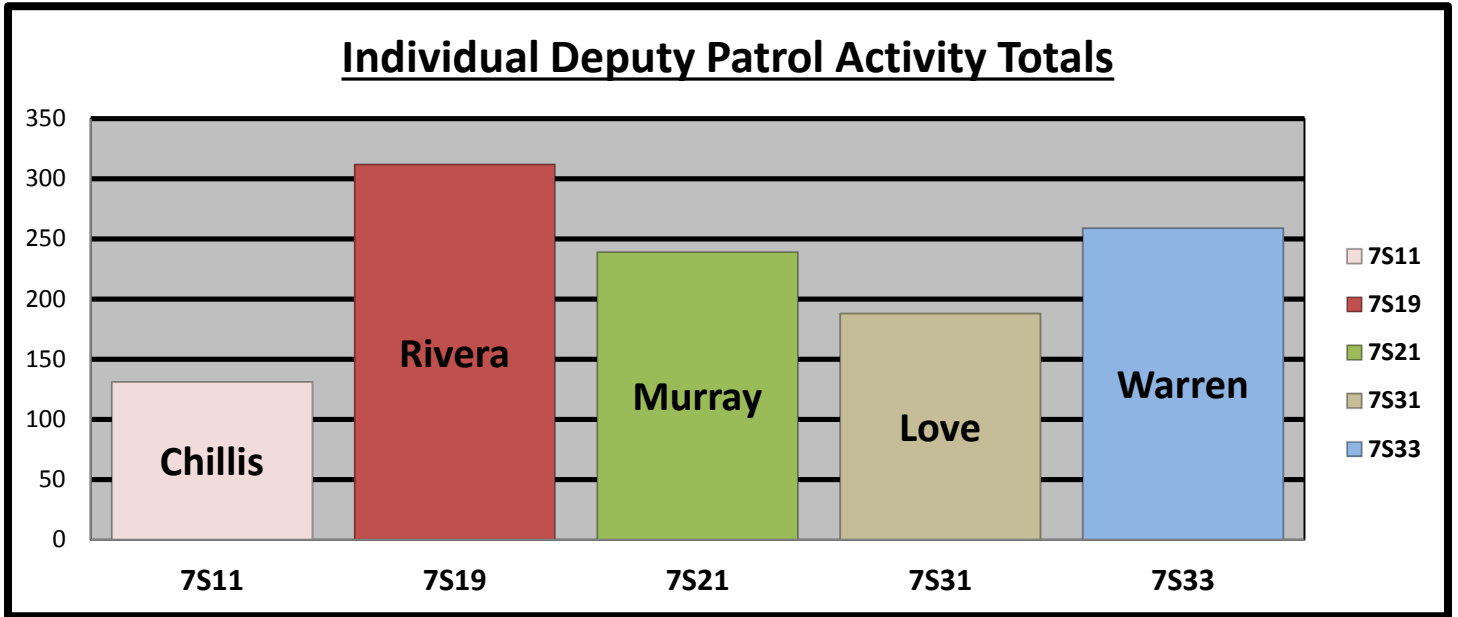

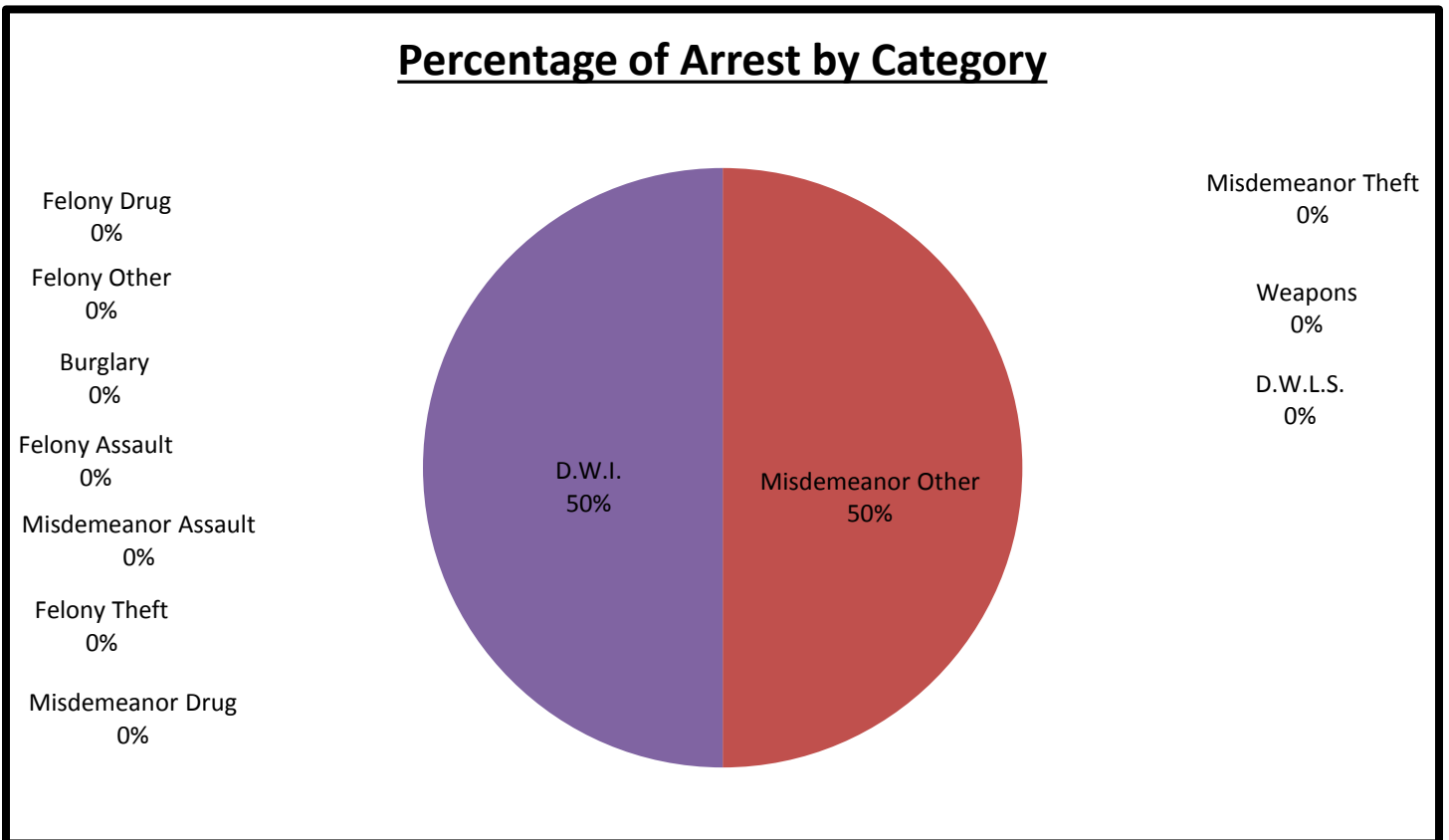
**E1. Types of Criminal Arrests Monthly Total:**

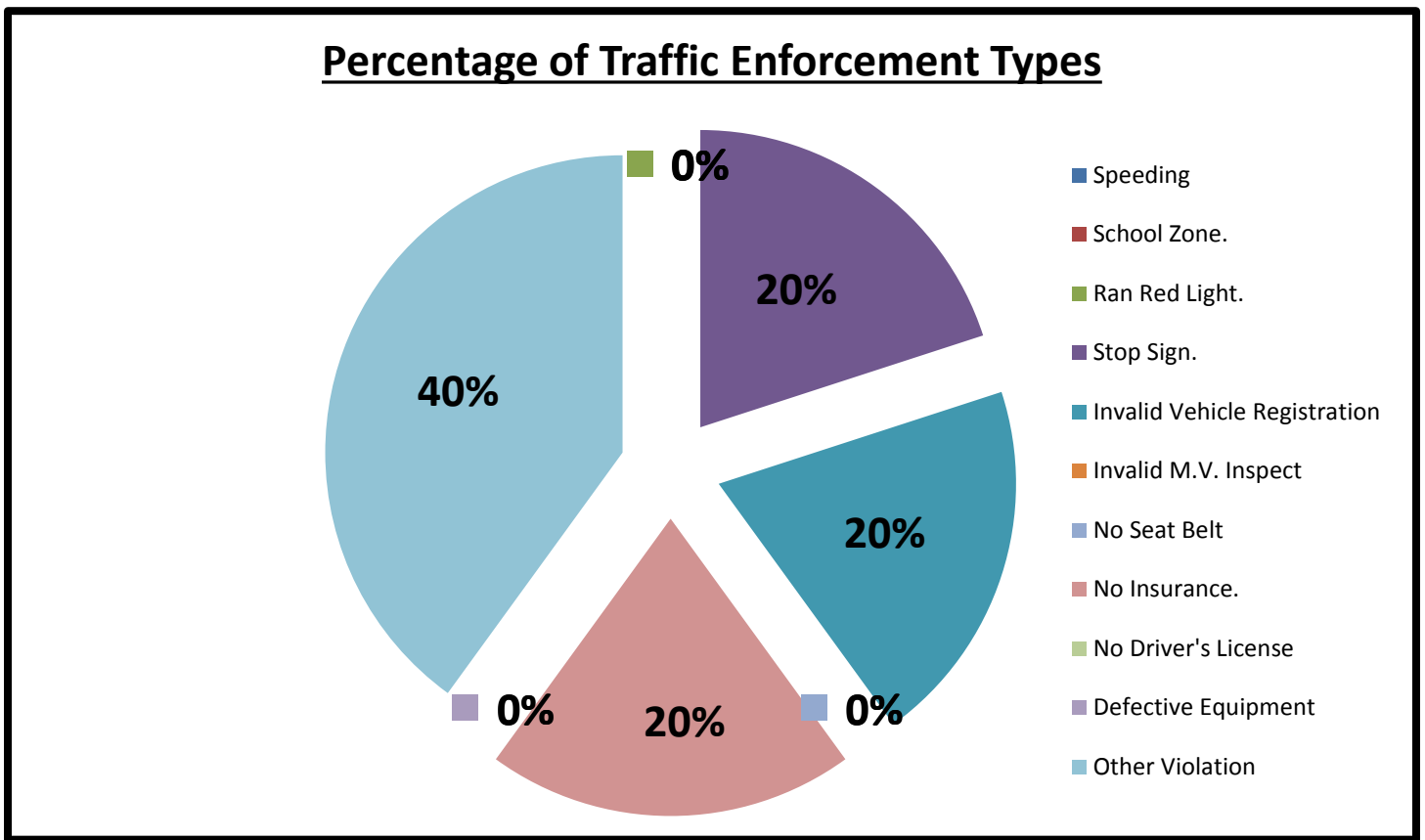

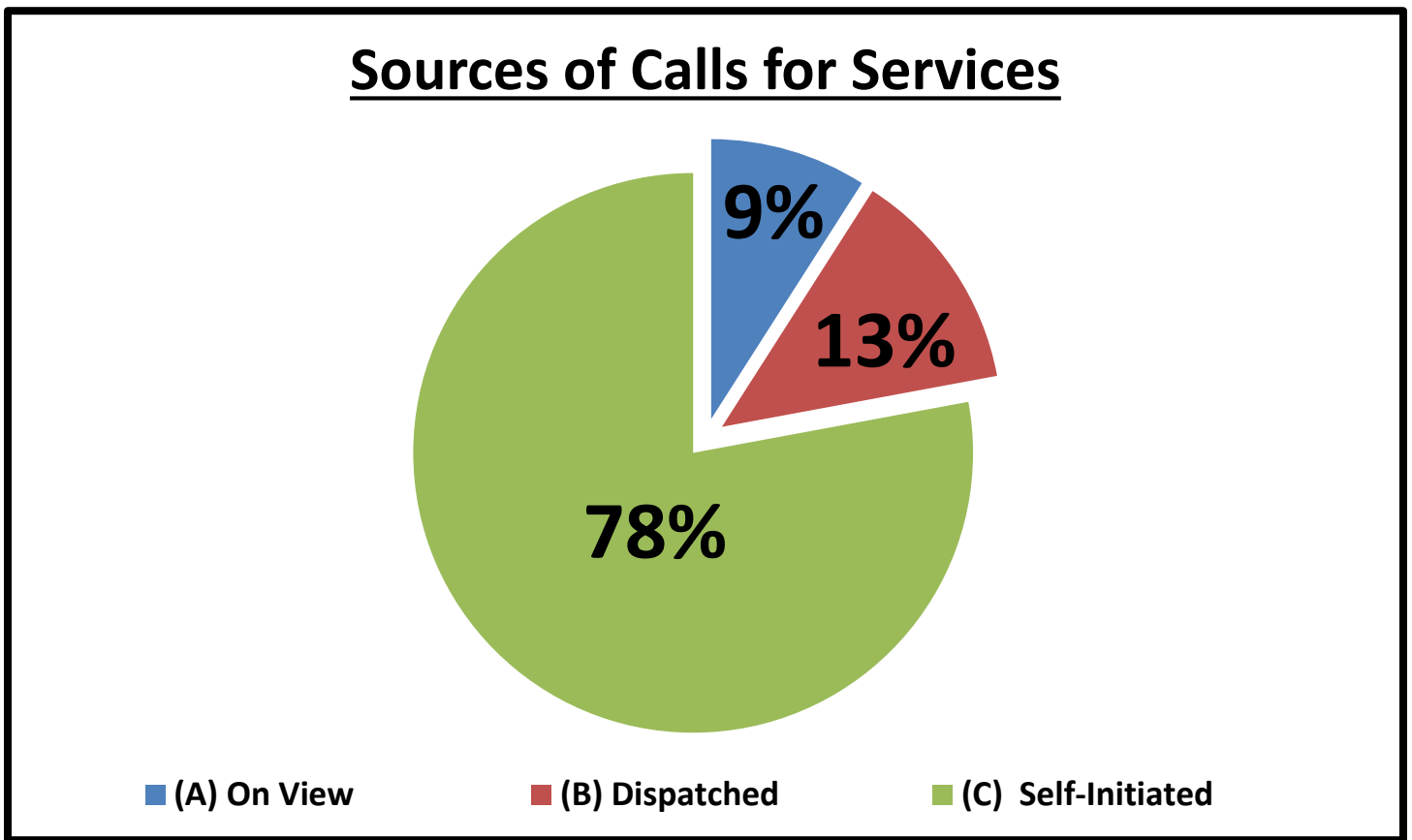
