Mr. Baird states, "I would like to commend Deputy Constable Angel Garcia." He informs, "At approximately 7:30am this morning, I was driving west bound on Sam Houston Toll Road. As I approached an overpass, I observed a female, sitting (facing west) on the concrete ledge on the north side of the west bound lanes. Your deputy parked his patrol vehicle east of her and was walking toward her. He grabbed her and brought her onto the shoulder of the west bound lanes. I stopped my vehicle in front of his vehicle and offered assistance. I could see that the female was distraught and crying. Your deputy stopped this woman from jumping off the overpass onto the road below. His actions should be commended in that he saved this woman's life without hesitation and placed his life in peril when he approached her." Mr. Baird concluded, "As a retired Pasadena Police Officer with 31 years of service, I have seen many commendable acts by officers go unnoticed by the public. All too often the police are criticized and countless acts of unselfishness and bravery go unnoticed. I am glad you have been made aware of your deputy's actions and hope the public is made aware too!"
